**SUMMARY**

This position is located in the Air National Guard, 147 Security Forces Squadron (SFS). Selectee must be able to develop plans, policies, and procedures specific to SF programs. Must articulate the ability to schedule and monitor SF activities and measure overall effectiveness of those activities. Selectee must be able to demonstrate the ability to provide oversight, guidance, and assistance to SF Commander via the application of technology, databases, and management control principles for all Security Force personnel, industrial, and resource protection related programs. Selectee must be able to provide on-scene incident command and supervision for SF activities. Inspect and evaluate effectiveness of SF personnel and program activities. Selectee must be able to analyze reports and statistics to advise SF Commander on trends. He or she must have experience supervising the management and implementation SF weapons training programs. Selectee must demonstrate a thorough understanding of SF armories operations, controls and safeguards of; arms, ammunition, and equipment. Selectee will be expected to provide guidance on weapons placement to security forces and ground defense force commanders. Selectee must be able to articulate an understanding of the employment and utilization of military working dog teams. He or she must be able to articulate a thorough understanding of SF training and certification standards. Selectee must have the demonstrated ability to lead, manage, supervise, and perform force protection duties, including a thorough understanding and the ability to articulate the use of deadly force to protect personnel and resources. Selectee must be able to demonstrate a comprehensive understanding of the protection of; nuclear and conventional weapons systems and PL 1, 2 and 3 level resources. Selectee must possess a comprehensive understanding of Integrated Defense functions as they contributing to the force protection mission. Must be able to demonstrate effective solutions and understand Integrated Defense as it relates to personnel, equipment, and resource requirements to protect from hostile forces. Selectee must have a thorough understanding of the SF Ready Augmentee program. Additionally, he or she must have proven, verifiable experience operating in various field environments, performing individual, and team patrol movements both mounted and dismounted. He or she must effectively communicate the justification for, tactical drills, battle procedures, and convoy training operations. Additionally, the selectee must be able to articulate military operations other than war, antiterrorism duties, and other special duties such as participating in the EET process. Selectee must be able to operate communications equipment, tactical and conventional vehicles, intrusion detection equipment, crew-served weapons, and other special purpose equipment. He or She must also be able to apply self-aid buddy care, life saving procedures, including cardiopulmonary resuscitation, as first responder to accident and disaster scenes.

**CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT**

1. Must be medically qualified under the provisions of AFI 48-123v2. An Induction physical must be conducted within 24 months prior to entry on AGR duty. An AF Form 422 must be completed if physical is more than 30 days old. HIV Test cannot be more than six (6) months old prior to the tour start date. Personnel Age 40 or older are required having a Risk Index calculated, if it exceeds 10,000 a stress EKG is required. Retention Physicals (Every five years) and Flight Physicals are not valid physicals for accession into the AGR Program.
2. Reference ANGI 36-101
3. Must be eligible to acquire a minimum of 20 years of active duty prior to his/her mandatory separation date or age 60. (Exceptions may be considered by The Adjutant General).
4. Airmen who voluntarily resigned from the AGR Program in lieu of adverse personnel actions or who have been involuntarily separated from the AGR Program are not eligible to reenter the program.
5. Individuals must NOT be eligible for, or receiving, an immediate Federal (military or civilian) annuity.

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLYING

- Interested applicants must submit the following mandatory documents.
  - NGB Form 34-1, Application for Active Guard/Reserve (AGR) Position.** Announcement number and position title must be annotated on this form.
  - Copy of Records Review RIP within last 30 days.** May be obtained from your Personnel Records at your unit. For Air Force/Air National Guard you can obtain your Records Review RIP from your Military Personnel Flight or go to <http://www.afpc.randolph.af.mil/vs> (**RIP must show your ASVAB scores and awarded AFSCs**). Records Review RIP must be no more than 30 calendar days old.
  - AF Form 422, Notification of Air Force Member's Qualification Status within last 12 months and AF 469, Duty Limiting Condition Report (if applicable).** **Fit to Fight AF Fitness Management Assessment** must be **no more than 12** months old. For Air Force/Air National Guard you can obtain your fitness assessment from you're the AF Portal, AFFMS – AF Fitness Management System.
  - DD Form 214s (if applicable)**
- Incomplete/expired paperwork will **NOT** be considered.
- Other documents (EPRs/OPRs, Resume, etc.) are **optional**.

## COMPLETION OF APPLICATION

Applicants must type or print in legible dark ink, **SIGN AND DATE** each application. Failure to sign and date these forms in **ORIGINAL SIGNATURE** will result in non-consideration. **Fax will not be accepted.** Applications will only be accepted if they are physically received in the Human Resource Office by **1630 hours** on the closing date of the announcement. No exceptions will be made.
